HOW IT WORKS

Our 12-week summer program (mid-May to mid-August) offers undergraduate and graduate students the choice of part-time (15-20 hours/week) or full-time (30-40 hours/week) placements with partner organizations. But SCIP is more than just an internship—it's a comprehensive learning experience grounded in three core themes: the UN Sustainable Development Goals, social innovation, and equity. Interns participate in weekly seminars that alternate between on-campus professional development sessions and site visits throughout the community, developing both technical skills and a deeper understanding of community-engaged sustainability work. We cover the full stipend (\$9,000 per full-time intern in Summer 2026), ensuring that partner organizations receive essential capacity building at no cost to them. This model allows community partners to focus their resources where they matter most: advancing their mission.

"I was immersed in many initiatives and gained experience in fields I would have never expected. In my second week I was calibrating air monitoring systems, collecting and synthesizing data, and after a few weeks, I taught what I learned to high school students.
